INFORMED

Making decisions about your life

- Choices must be voluntary & free from coercion
- You must have all the information to make an informed decision

INFORMED CHOICE CHOICE

- You must have the opportunity to ask questions and get answers
- You may choose or refuse any alternative presented

Good information means good decisions!

PLACEMENT DECISIONS

You decide your supports & services

* Attend & speak at any meeting about your placement * Bring friends, relatives, a lawyer to a meeting * Agree or disagree with decisions * Leave your placement * receive services close to your home * Live with the least restrictions placed upon you

PLACEMENT DECISIONS

- A service plan developed just for you
- The right to refuse any medication, treatment, or service
- Services which promote your independence
- Privacy during treatment
- Quality services

These are your rights!

APPITIONAL APPITIONAL

You cannot be ...

- Physically or chemically restrained
- Physically or verbally abused
- Forced to take drugs to control your mood
 - Ignored for your needs
 - Put in a room alone

RIGHTS RIGHTS

Physical restraints or medication may only be used when other methods to prevent harm to you or others have failed.

Restraints must be written into your plan and approved by you

BASIC KIGHTS treated with respect

free from abuse, neglect, exploitation

not discriminated against
